

Nation Cup Criteria

Each Nation may nominate between 3-8 members of their choice across any or all of the Levels run at the event

Each Nation must have a minimum of 3 team members in order to count. If a nation can not find a minimum of 3 members to represent the nation or has less than 3 completing riders, the score will not be counted and therefore the Nation will not be placed. Only 3 members will count toward the score

At the end of the competition 3 of the completing rider's placings will be added together for each team. The team with the lowest score will win.

Pairs will be treated as one unit, if within a pair there are two nations, then the pair must nominate which country they will be representing.

The Nation placing's are determined as follows

1 - the highest placed three riding units per Nation are added together - the lowest total being placed first, etc.

2 - in the event of 1 resulting in a tie then the highest placed two riding units per tying Nation are added together - the lowest total being placed highest, etc.

3 - in the event of 2 still resulting in a tie then the highest placed riding unit per tying Nation are used - the lowest total being placed highest, etc.

4 - if we get this far then it is a tie.

Competitors can only represent the nation that they were either born or currently reside in or have grandfather rights.

Example:

Rule 1 -

England

Fred – 1st Level 2 Individual

Jim – 4th Level 2a Pairs

Paul – 4th Level 2a Pairs

George – 8th Level 3 Individual

Francis – 2nd Level 4

Total: 1 + 2 + 4 = 7

Wales

Bryn – 3rd Level 2 Pairs

Robert - 3rd Level 2 Pairs

Jack – 6th Level 2A Individual

Philip – 2nd Level 3 Individual

John – 1st Level 4 Individual

Total: 3 + 3 + 1 = 7

Both England & Wales tie.

Rule 2 –

England: $1 + 2 = 3$

Wales: $1 + 3 = 4$

Under this rule, England win.
