

Rule changes/amendments for 2020

The 5th edition of the British TREC Rulebook will not be re published for 2020, these amendments will be published on the TREC GB website. They will then be added to the next edition of the rulebook.

The amendments and changes are detailed below.

Changes are shown in **BOLD** type.



- 4.2.1 Page 24 : Maps
Removal of 1:50000 maps. New wording:
The route is usually shown to each competitor on 1:25000 Ordnance Survey maps or maps scaled to show even greater detail. Maps at a scale of 1:50000 are no longer to be used.
- 4.10.1 Page 29 : Ticket points
Added at the end of the current rule.
These should be placed so they can clearly be seen by the riders when they are riding the correct route intended.
- 6.3.5 Page 42 : Maximum Jump heights
Change last sentence to read.
'Maximum jump height for Level 4 is 1.10m at all competitions.'
- 6.7.6 Page 48 : Attempting an obstacle
Part one: ~~Removal of the wording as added last year. A rider who attempts an obstacle twice (straight after each other) will be given 0 for that obstacle.~~
Part two: **A rider must attempt to perform the obstacle in the correct manner as per course plan, otherwise an error of course will be applied.**
- App 3 Page 61 : Fluorescent / Hi - Viz clothing
The minimum requirement is clearly visible fluorescent **and reflective strips** on the area of the rider's torso.
(These must be clean and not faded, when presented at the tack check.)
- App 3 Page 62 : Recommended POR equipment
A **foil emergency blanket** has been added to the list of recommended equipment.
- S - 4 Page 79 : Remount
Remount from ground only:
Using the mounting block **Levels 1 & 2 minus 3, Levels 3 & 4 minus 6**
- A - 9 5.4 Page 104/105 : VTH (Versatile TREC Horse)
VTH sheet/test 1: In Hand
Remove extra score of 10 under Maximum Score at movement one. (Printing error)
VTH sheet/test 2: Novice
Add score of 10 under Maximum Score at movement four. (Printing error)
- Page 136 : Water crossing obstacle: Any drop into or step out of water may only be used as an associated difficulty (i.e. if a route around it is possible.)

Clarification, the wording, ~~'or if 0.5m or less in height'~~ has been **removed** from the end of the 1st bullet point in Features.
